

SCHOOL DRESS CODE

The community of Leeming Senior High School, through its School Board, has chosen to have a designated School Uniform for the following reasons:

1. Enhances a sense of belonging, equality and community spirit.
2. Separates school from leisure time, focusing students' efforts on learning.
3. Prepares students for the expectation of post school employment.
4. Assists the school to identify unwelcome strangers.
5. Promotes a positive image of the school by ensuring a minimum standard of presentations of all students.



Shirts, Jumpers and Jackets



All official Leeming SHS branded uniform items are permitted, however please note that the sports polo is only for use during physical education – students should change into and out of their uniform during the allocated time at the start and end of the physical education lesson.

Plain navy-blue sweaters and jackets are permitted however they should not include logos or additional designs that cannot be covered by a 50 cent coin. Images, stripes or logos larger than this are not permitted.

Students may also choose to wear plain white short or long sleeve shirts underneath their uniform, with the same rules regarding images, stripes or logos.

No hooded items of clothing are permitted.

Pants, shorts, skirts and dresses

All official Leeming SHS branded uniform items are permitted. Plain navy-blue pants or shorts are permitted, and tracksuit pants should be made of microfiber material. They should not include logos or additional designs that cannot be covered by a 50-cent coin. Images, stripes or logos larger than this are not permitted. All pants, shorts, skirts and dresses should be an appropriate length for a business environment. No denim or fleece tracksuit pants are permitted.

Hats, beanies and head coverings

Leeming SHS encourages students to cover up when outdoors, and students are permitted to wear a hat or cap of their choice outside of classrooms. These should be removed before entering any building in the school. Students are permitted to wear beanies on the way to and from school, but should remove beanies on arrival to school.

Students who are required to wear head coverings for cultural or religious reasons are permitted to do so.
